The North Shore Water Reclamation (NSWRD) held its annual organizational meeting on Wednesday, December 14th. Following a Call to Order and a Roll Call, elected Trustees including Preston Carter representing Ward 1 (Winthrop Harbor, Zion, and Beach Park), Stephen Drew representing Ward 2 (North Waukegan), Beverly Sugar Young representing Ward 3 (North Chicago, and south Waukegan), Thomas Swarthout representing Ward 4 (Lake Forest, Lake Bluff, and North Chicago), and Rhoda A. Pierce representing Ward 5 (Highland Park, Highwood, and sections of Lake Forest and Deerfield) took the Oath of Office. Stephen Drew was named President of the District, Beverly Sugar Young was named Vice President, and Rhoda A. Pierce was named Treasurer. Executive Director Dave Miller was named Deputy Treasurer, Mary Jo Bryant was named Secretary, and Gregory T. Jackson was named Attorney of the District. Regular Board Meeting Dates were then set for the second Wednesday of every month in 2023.

The North Shore Water Reclamation District is a municipal body dedicated to the beneficial reuse of our water resources while protecting Lake Michigan, local waterways, and the environment through sustainable and fiscally responsible wastewater reclamation practices at our facilities. The NSWRD owns and operates three major Water Reclamation Facilities (WRF) located in Gurnee, Waukegan, and Highland Park, Illinois, and more than one hundred miles of intercepting sewer lines and ten pumping stations which collect and convey wastewater from local sewer systems to the WRFs. Additional NSWRD facilities include the Biosolids Recycling Facility in Zion, the Administration Building and Laboratory in Gurnee, and the Maintenance

Building in Waukegan. The District is the second largest water reclamation district in Illinois serving more than 300,000 people in eastern Lake County.
